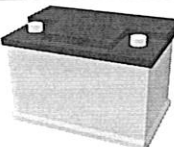

dated as young adults. Both of us took different life paths and both were widowed. Funny, when we got back together, we both still had those senior prom pictures. We have been married now for 14 wonderful years.

Gary and I moved to Venice Isle and became full time residents in 2013. We live in what was my parent's home on Mantua Dr. My parents, Ruth and Herb Hauger moved into Venice Isle in 1982 and were among the original shareholders. Some of you may remember them. My aunt, my sister and my cousins are also full-time shareholders now.

Gary and I weren't very good at retirement. So, we bid on and were awarded a contract with Sarasota County Parks and Recreation to operate the North Jetty Fish Camp and Beach Park Concession on Casey Key on the Gulf of Mexico. We owned and operated our waterfront Tap and Grill for 7 years. Many Venice Isle residents were welcome patrons there to eat, drink and enjoy the water. In June we have once again retired.

So, you see I am very invested in Venice Isle.

WHAT IS AN HOA?

Venice Isle is a 55 and older community covering 128 acres with 992 homes. We are just like a small town. Instead of being governed by a town council, we are governed by a Board of nine directors. These nine directors are charged with the operation of Venice Isle and, in doing so, must act in accordance with Section 719, Florida Statutes. The Board has delegated the management of **Venice Isle Day to day operations to a manager.**

The board consists of four persons who hold the following offices:

1. President
2. Vice President
3. Secretary
4. Treasurer

and five other individuals. Each Board member serves a three-year term. No one Board member has more than 1 vote on matters brought before the board for its vote.

Very few of us would argue that we do not need **rules and regulations such as traffic lights and stop signs. Traffic lights and stop signs enable everyone** to use the roads in an orderly fashion. Like any small town, Venice Isle has its own rules and regulations to enable a resident to cooperatively enjoy their residences and the amenities. These rules and regulations may be modified by the Board from time to time as changes in the community's circumstances require.

When you purchase a home in Venice Isle, you receive a membership share (evidenced by a **share certificate**) **and an assignment of the right to** occupy the lot where your home is situated. As a shareholder, you are entitled to attend and speak at meetings of the Board and the annual shareholders meeting.

When you become a shareholder, you agree to abide by the rules and regulations established by the Board, even if you do not recall signing anything or reading any of Venice Isle's governing documents. These rules and regulations, as tested by time and experience, are established for everyone's benefit (even though some people dispute this fact). Some of our rules are self-governing, such as the 15-mph speed limit, using respectful behavior in common areas and similar common – sense principles.

The Board has authorized some committees to advise and guide it in making decisions. These committees are made up of shareholders of Venice Isle. They pool their talents, observations, and **experience to assist the Board in writing these rules and regulations as well as enforcing them. A good example of one continually active committee** is the Compliance Committee. This committee is composed of shareholders to whom the Board has delegated the responsibility

for ensuring that every **home and lot in Venice Isle meet Venice Isle's** minimum standards for appearance, including but not limited to weeding, keeping bushes and trees **trimmed, and maintaining the exterior of the home** in good condition.

To each committee, the Board has appointed a chairperson and a Board member who acts as liaison between the committee and the Board. The chairperson is charged with overall performance of the committee. The Board liaison is charged with the direction the committee takes and communicating with the Board.

Your Board members serve without compensation. You do not need to have any special skills or training to become a Board member, except a sincere desire to participate in the governance of Venice Isle in accordance with Section 719, Florida Statutes, and our governing documents, and help make everyone's experience in Venice Isle a one. Depending on whether you are an officer as well as a director or just a director, a Board member may be involved with any Board business anywhere from 5 to 15 hours per week, and sometimes more, if necessary.

The operation and management of Venice Isle **is just like running a business; after all, it is a \$4 million business. To be effective and contribute** meaningfully, a Board member should have a good grasp of how a business operates, have a basic understanding of **Robert's Rules of Order (how to conduct meetings) and accounting and financial concepts, be willing to learn and comprehend Venice Isle's governing documents and Section 719, Florida Statutes as well as related laws, and be able to use common sense.**

The members of the Board work for you, the residents. When you have a question or need clarification, **call a Board member or the Manager** for reliable, truthful information.

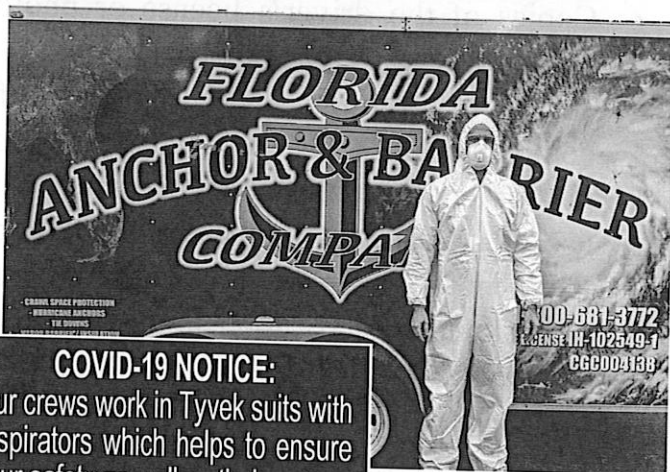

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THE RENTAL OF YOUR VENICE ISLE HOMES IS YOUR RESPONSIBILITY.

It is YOUR responsibility to make sure ALL the required paperwork is turned in to be processed, not your tenant's.

It is YOUR responsibility to furnish gate access and facility access for your tenants, the current copy of the rules and regulations and the prospectus. The Office does not provide them to your tenant.

As the person renting out your home, it is YOUR responsibility to gather and furnish the Office the following:

- Copies of the driver's license or photo ID with birthdate for each of your tenants.
- The background check release form completed including social security number. If your tenant is from another country, please use the non-US citizen form and SIN number.
- Payment for the processing of the background check and rental application payable to Venice Isle Homeowners, Inc. Amounts are indicated on the forms.
- Payment of the Rental Application fee of \$100 every time the property is rented. Make checks payable to Venice Isle Homeowners, Inc.
- Owner's Permission to rent form, which requires your signature on the back of page 2.
- Sublessee Registration form.
- Privacy Policy Form
- Receipt of Documents
- Background Screening Form for each tenant, signed by the applicant tenant.

All the above must be submitted in one package. Once you have submitted a complete package, we will begin processing them. You will be notified you're your tenants have been approved.

Incomplete rental application packages will be returned to you and your rental will not be approved.

COMPLIANCE COMMITTEE

The Compliance Committee Is made up of 10 shareholders. The Board vested them with such duties as visiting homes in the park to ensure compliance with Article 8 of our Rules, Regulations and Policies, and notifying the owners that power washing, weed removal, painting, tree and bush trimming, and repairs and other work is needed to bring the home into compliance. They will also make note of any other infractions of other Rules, such as the presence of trash and rubbish or unauthorized vehicles on the property, for the Park Manager to handle.

Three members of the Committee will inspect a portion of the park together, and if they see a possible Rule violation, they will contact the owner in person or by telephone to discuss what is needed to remedy the violation and the time within which the owner must act. If they are unable to contact the owner, they will hand their report over to the Park Manager to write a letter to the owner.

The general timetable for remedial work is:

- Five (5) days to remove weeds and rubbish, and trim trees and bushes.
- Thirty (30) days to pressure wash and paint.
- Fifteen (15) days for any other remedial action.

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CHANNEL 195 NEWS AND UPDATES

What can you expect from your Channel 195 this year? A lot!

But first, let's do a little refresher course on the changes to 195 from last season. We implemented the new Touchdown software in January of this year and the 195 team spent the winter and spring learning how to use the features we have at our disposal with this new software platform. As you may have noticed, the announcements that you see on 195 are a lot more professional looking than they were in the past because our team is no longer handicapped by old software. **More important, all the slides can now be viewed on your laptop, tablet or phone.**

We started broadcasting Board meetings on 195, making it more convenient for those of us who may have difficulty making it to the clubhouse. Another feature of the new software is the ability to broadcast video on the channel and we did that last season with movie nights, tutorials, and special events. We also implemented four new features on the Community Apps site, a **Resident Directory**, a **VI Documents resource**, a **Recipe file section**, and a **Video archive**. If you haven't looked at these new features, look. Just go to www.communityapps.com and log in with the username and password that was sent to you last February and browse around. If you don't remember your username and password or have lost it, no problem, just send a request to 195directory@gmail.com and include your name, address and phone number and we'll send you your information.

As a side bar, over the next couple of months we will post tutorials and hold training sessions in Clubhouse 2 on how to access Community Apps and how to get the most out of them for those of us who aren't quite sure what to do first.

Now, what's new for the upcoming season? Let's start with what will be airing on Channel

195. This season, besides the announcements and live broadcasts, we'll be televising entertainment five nights a week at 7:00 PM. On Monday and Wednesday, we'll be airing classic movies; the type you might see on TCM or the Hallmark Channel. (Movies from the 40s through the 90s). All will be rated PG and should be suitable for all audiences. On Friday this season we're going to go in a different direction. If you remember from your youth the Friday Night Creature Feature, well, we're going to be running old horror movies like Frankenstein, the Mummy and Dracula as well as some Sci-Fi flicks like Earth vs. The Flying Saucers. Just a little bit of fun on Friday night. On Saturday we'll be airing music concerts. We'll try to cover all genres from Bluegrass to Rock and Gospel to Big Band. On Sunday we'll run TV serials, such as Sherlock Holmes (mystery), Red Green (comedy), The Adventures of Ozzie and Harriet (sitcom) or The Untouchables (crime). We'll run each for a month and then switch to another genre. Another thing that we will experiment with is special events like parades, music on the veranda or resident dinners.

Here is where YOU come in. Let me explain. Our 195 team is very small and can't cover all special events that happen in the park. So unless someone wants to volunteer to become the park videographer, what we need is you and your cell phone. Let's say that there is a dance at the clubhouse. Since we won't be there to record it, and you are, just whip out your cell phone. Take some video, interview others at the dance and send your video to vichannel195@gmail.com. If we get enough video from multiple people, we'll edit it together and air it on Channel 195. After it's aired, we'll move it to the VI Video archive so you can watch it anytime you want.

By the time you read this article, the schedule for entertainment for Channel 195 through the end of the year will be finalized and posted

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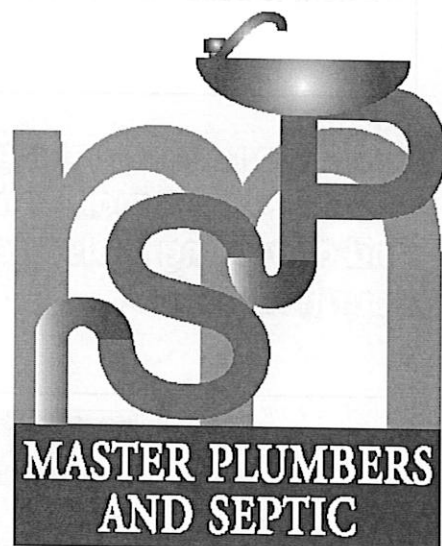

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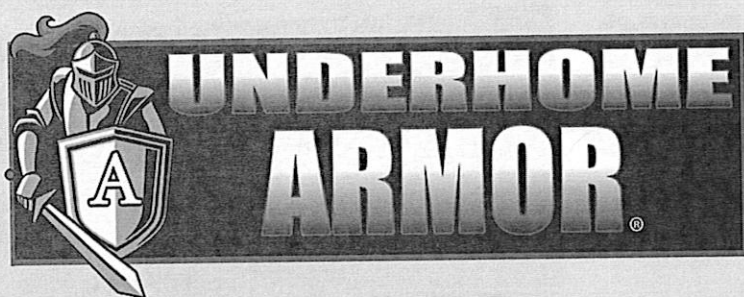

- The Bus does not pick up at the Club Houses
- Users must reserve a seat and notify driver of destination, call

- For resident use only
- Runs 4 days per week – Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday
- Users must wear mask
- Users may not board the bus if they have a temperature over 100 degrees F. Users will be scanned prior to entering the bus. Those who refuse to be scanned will be denied access to the bus.
- Users are asked to maintain CDC and Florida DOH guidelines (Social Distancing)
- Infractions will result in cessation of bus service.

PARKING OF VEHICLES IN VENICE ISLE

Parking of cars is permitted only on paved streets, in carports and approved cement or paver areas (only adjacent to the driveway, not in the front of the main unit). Overnight parking in club houses 1 @ 2 parking lots requires a permit obtained from the office. Parking on stones, lawns, shells, mulch, or any other material other than pavers or unit driveway is not permitted.

New paver installations or concrete pads, with downspouts must be buried and terminate at the street or no closer than 10 feet from the side or rear of the property line, and not discharge on unusual slope where the discharge will interfere with the neighboring unit.

Pavers require a border to keep them securely placed, except where the pavers meet the street.

Any stone, rock, mulch, or shells are required to have a border installed to contain them and if they meet the street, must have curbing that meets park standards.

BE SMART! GET APPROVAL FIRST!

Every Venice Isle resident should read our current Rules, Regulations and Policies, adopted in May of this year, before making any alterations to the outside of his or her home and/or lot.

Before you make any exterior changes, our Rules, Regulations and Policies require that you must have the approval of the Venice Isle Architectural Committee *before* any changes are made. Getting approval is extremely easy: just fill out a Home Improvement Application, available at the Office and on the Venice Isle website; describe your proposed changes in detail, return the completed form to the Office.

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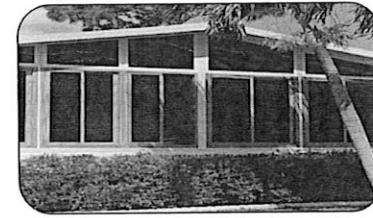

One or more members of the Architectural Committee will contact you to discuss your application.

What is considered an "exterior change" to your home and lot? Exterior changes include painting your home, your trim or even just your driveway; adding any kind of fence on your lot; laying concrete walks or driveways; installing pavers; adding onto or enclosing parts of your shed or lanai; removing or installing trees, shrubs, and landscape features such as boulders or water features; having a new home installed and your old one removed; adding new, or changing, your existing vinyl siding.

The Architectural Committee has put together a guide that sets forth the hard-to-find rules and restrictions, most of which were scattered throughout our by-laws, our Rules, Regulations and Policies and memoranda issued by Venice Isle since 1996, when it was established as a cooperative. There are some new guidelines as well. With this guide, the Architectural Committee's goal is to assist you in fulfilling your vision for improvements at your home by helping you interpret the various rules and guidelines and applying them to your plans. We may even have a few ideas you did not dream up on your own.

Getting the Architectural Committee involved prior to making changes will benefit you in many ways. The Architectural Committee's volunteer members are very experienced and can assist you with the design and planning of your improvement. Our suggestions can often help you save money and improve your plans.

Several residents have made the mistake of making changes without obtaining the approval of the Architectural Committee. Not only does this violate our Rules, Regulations and Policies, but may also violate State or County laws as well. Some residents have been required to remove the changes and restore the home and lot to their previous condition. Effective October 1,

2021, Venice Isle will start fining residents who make changes without the prior approval of the Architectural Committee.

In addition, before you sell your home, the Architectural Committee will inspect it and may require restoration or remedial work to be performed if they find that a violation of the Rules, Regulations and Policies has occurred. The resident may not close on the sale of the home until the violation has been corrected.

Remember that members and renters alike must observe the Rules, Regulations and Policies and that members are responsible for any changes that their renters make.

We recommend that all members read and be familiar with our Rules, Regulations and Policies, especially Section 8, which deals with the care of your home, lot, and lawn area. If you do, you will help keep Venice Isle beautiful, consistent, and compliant.

About neighbors helping others – Many at VI have expressed a desire to help others in the park who need it with simple tasks. I have seen many help neighbors whenever needed. I have done so myself as I am sure most have. So, I started a new Facebook group called **Venice Isle Job Jar** - if you need help with something like carrying in or out something, put it on the group. If you want to help, you can respond.

It is where you can request help with a small, simple, one-time tasks and where, people who want to help, can find those who would appreciate it. While we fully support local

contractors, many times the job is just too small to formally contract it out. For example, I bought something at the store, and I need help carrying it in. More examples include, I just got told I have only days or weeks, to fix something the compliance committee told me was wrong, but I can't get up on a ladder to clean / paint / screw it in or whatever. There are no guarantees that you will get a response to your help request but there are many people in VI who have expressed the desire to help their neighbors. The problem was that we did not know who needed it.

The rules are (please read **these**).

1. You agree to hold harmless both the helper and helped. If something breaks or somebody hurts themselves, nobody gets to sue or charge the other.
2. No charge, obligation, or barter will be involved.
3. Keep it simple. Post a task or say you will help.
4. Don't post reviews of each other. Keep confidential what you did or saw.
5. If you respond that you can help – Show up! Don't leave the requestor hanging.
6. Don't post things you would normally pay for. There is a list of contractors at the office for more involved jobs.
7. Be benevolent not critical.
8. Let us know when the task was completed so we can take it off the list.

5. Please remove or have someone remove your posting when your property is rented or sold.

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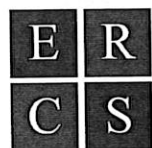
